Current Regulatory Challenges in Exports and Imports

Mr. R.R Padmanabhan spoke on the topic "Current Regulatory Challenges in Exports and Imports". He mentioned that the exports under EPCG and Advance Licenses are to be properly mentioned in the shipping bill, and failure to mention the licence numbers in the shipping bill will amount to no export under these schemes, and may prove a costly affair while going for redemption of these licences.

The certification is applicable for the import of plastics and its waste, electronics and its waste, e-waste like hard disk and chips, tyres etc. He also spoke about LMPC (Legal Metrology Protection Consumers) which is applicable whenever there is an import of

prepackaged commodities. He also explained about the export of drones which is a very big opportunity. The authorisation is valid for 3 years and governed by GAED (General Authorisation for Export of Drones).

India is a start-up nation, with 110 plus unicorns and 90,000 plus start-ups, where the customer is the king and competition is high. Overcoming challenges due to factors such as globalization, pricing pressures, the internet and social media plays a vital role in the success of a company.

He also explained that data is the new oil in which Facebook, Uber, and Alibaba play a major role. He informed about the myth of innovation, which is not a linear process which is Basic Research,

Applied Research, Development and Commercialization. Also, he presented some slides on non-linear model of innovation. He also explained different technology readiness levels based on a

Industrial Visit to Bull Machines Pvt Ltd., on 13th August 2024



The 12th Industrial visit for the MC members and the faculty from student chapter institutions was arranged by Coimbatore Management Association to **M/S. Bull Machines Private Limited, Sulur, Coimbatore,** on 13.08.2024.

A 18-Member delegation visited M/S, Bull Machines Private Limited, Sulur, Coimbatore, a heavy engineering equipment manufacturing company which was established in the year 1997 to



manufacture tractor attached loaders initially, became the leader in India in this sector, and subsequently kickstarted manufacturing their own brand Backhoe loaders, a heavy engineering product for construction industries, mining, agri, and stone crushers in Coimbatore.

CMA had thoughtfully chosen a heavy engineering manufacturing company as Coimbatore had all along been an industrial city with



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thousands of textile industries, and motor and pump manufacturers. But one entrepreneur, Mr. V. Conversing about the unique HR policies that are highly essential for a growth and sustenance of any organization, Ms. Poornima, DGM-HR, listed out the most modern HR practices being performed in their group. Using Gen AI in Cybersecurity



WE COVER LATEST TECHNOLOGIES AND TRENDS IN MANUFACTURING



Gen AI is doing rounds in the cybersecurity space and becoming a gamechanger as it can handle large amount of risk data with quick turnaround time. As cyber threats are growing significantly in this digital era, the need for robust security protection controls against cyber-attacks is increasing in this society.

The amount of data that the organization holds is also humongous to digest and keep track of the holistic picture. The lack of data visibility and gaining critical insights are weak in most places. To address the same, applying Gen AI in cybersecurity space in today's digital-first world can enhance their cyber security measures while customizing the control points as per customer requirements and organizational needs.

Gen Al is in niche area where organizations are looking at inclining in cybersecurity controls creating tremendous opportunities to enhance security measures. Gen Al can detect potential threats and vulnerabilities by analyzing vast amounts of data while providing proactive predictive analysis, anomaly detections, threat management, automated responses to attacks, effective incident management with appropriate communications and furthermore. Additionally, the Gen Al can help the organizations in advancing

authentication systems and simulate attack scenarios to test the effectiveness of security measures to enhance the cyber resilience posture.

How GenAl helps in strengthening Cybersecurity controls

In the context of cybersecurity, Gen AI plays a versatile role in multiple layers revolutionizing traditional cyber defence mechanisms and enhancing the capabilities of cybersecurity experts/SMEs/professionals.

Gen AI has already been implemented in several real-life cybersecurity scenarios, providing predictive analysis, automated response, threat detection, Incident management, authentication and security testing to enhance the current cybersecurity posture. Some of the key capabilities that Gen AI helps in strengthening Cybersecurity controls are as follows:



Imagine the potential of this new Gen AI technology integrated with industries like BFSI, healthcare, manufacturing and cybersecurity, where it can be used to create, automate, and innovate





solutions, to primarily addressing the evolving cybersecurity glitches. However, with enhancing opportunities and applications in cybersecurity, Gen AI comes with its own risks and challenges. Some of the key challenges are quoted below.

Challenges In Implementing Generative AI In Cyber Security

Despite the potential benefits of using Gen AI in cyber-security, there are always some foreseen risks and challenges associated with it.

As technology grows and evolves day by day, some significant challenges are accompanied through them. Predators or cyber hackers use Gen AI to develop more sophisticated cyber threats with realistic approaches to exploit the users' network.

Using Gen AI in cyber-security is a potential bias. Gen AI has become a great and essential tool in cyber-security because of its ability to detect and prevent cyber-attacks more efficiently than traditional methods; however, AI algorithms are prone to discriminatory outcomes due to bias.

Using biased algorithms in cyber-security has ethical implications, particularly regarding social justice and fairness. Bias can arise from different sources that may mislead the user trying to adapt.

Ethical considerations around based algorithms in cyber-security are very important from a fairness and transparency standpoint. It's also important to ensure that training data is varied and users to reduce biases while using the AI algorithms.

Some of the key challenges prevailing in the niche environment are:

- Shortage of GenAl competent resources available within the organizations in this niche area.
- Implementing or using Gen AI needs access to large and highquality datasets which is a global challenge in getting the right visibility to implement Gen AI in cyber-security.
- Confrontational attacks on generative AI models are evolving, as malicious inputs can cause the model to produce misleading or incorrect outputs to the end users.
- Double-edged sword: Malicious Gen Al v/s penetration of valuable data.
- Inconsistency around data privacy laws, policies, and regulations

- Misunderstood inputs due to low-quality data used to train Al systems
- Transparency and explainability are critical in cybersecurity to effectively identify potential threats and validate model outputs.
- Bias is a serious consideration and challenge for business while enabling Gen AI in cyber-security, and the impact of data bias can be serious to mislead the expectations.
- Malicious actors can use AI to create convincing phishing emails or messages by analyzing and emulating a target individual's or organization's writing styles and behavior patterns. This is an emerging threat that's evolving day by day.
- Al-generated algorithms can automate detecting and exploiting software vulnerabilities, making it faster for malicious actors to penetrate targeted systems and networks.

Gen AI based cyber-security solutions are yet to function independently without human intervention. Cyber-security SMEs play a critical role to ensure that AI-based cyber systems are not subject to manipulation using false logic or providing misleading outputs.

However, Gen AI is changing the old legacy of manual control efforts in most of the cyber defence areas and its enhancing in the faster response to threats on sensitive data.

Gen Al is capable of a lot of possibilities and managing large scale data without challenges; however, we must be mindful of the security risks or challenges it can bring.

This mindful consideration is primarily due to uncensored prompts, misleading outputs, misconceptions, accidentally revealing sensitive data, problems with storing data, difficulties with global laws, and information leak are the vulnerabilities in this growing niche area.

Addressing these evolving challenges, we need to take a holistic approach that combines Gen AI with other cyber-security practices and on-going vigilance to stay ahead of growing threats.

The possibilities of using Gen AI in cyber-security are truly endless, and we are only at the beginning of this exciting journey to evolve, adapt, use, and protect the business environment.




